When - Both bell and hot peppers need to be germinated 8 to 10 weeks before the last spring frost date. 1.2 In Iowa, where our frost date is around April 20, Feb. 9 is an ideal day to begin germinating peppers indoors. You can, however, begin germinating anytime between Feb. 9 and the 23rd.

## Transplant Peppers into the Garden: May 11

Fun fact: Green and red bell peppers are actually the same pepper, the red bell peppers have just been allowed to mature on the plant longer, which changes their color and lets them develop a higher Vitamin C content. More mature peppers also tend to be sweeter than their greener counterparts.
