**DECLARATION OF ALEXANDRA “SONDRA” WILSON REGARDING CURRENT
BALLOT-ACCESS FEASIBILITY**

I, Alexandra “Sondra” Wilson, being competent to testify and having personal knowledge of the matters stated below, declare as follows:

1. I am the Petitioner-Appellant in this action and remain a candidate seeking qualification for Iowa’s November 3, 2026 general-election ballot.
2. I presently possess approximately **1,000 petition signatures** collected toward qualification for the ballot. This is an approximate collection count and does not represent that every signature has already undergone official validity review.
3. I retain the original petition sheets and materials associated with the signatures I collected.
4. I do not seek waiver or reduction of Iowa’s statutory signature requirement or county-distribution requirement. If relief is granted, I intend to satisfy those requirements in full.
5. On at least one day when I was able to devote substantial time to petition circulation, I gathered approximately **60 signatures**. I do not represent that this rate can be sustained as a daily average over an extended multi-week period, and I offer it as an illustration of demonstrated individual capacity on a favorable day rather than as a projection of sustained output.
6. Based upon the approximately 1,000 signatures presently collected, approximately 2,500 additional signatures would be required to reach the statutory numerical threshold of 3,500, without accounting for prudent additional collection to protect against signatures that might later be challenged or rejected.

7. I recognize that reaching the statutory threshold within the remaining election calendar will require sustained personal effort and, realistically, meaningful volunteer assistance. I am prepared to undertake both.
8. I presently have continuing litigation obligations in *Wilson v. Reliable Street Inc., et al.* that I expect to remain particularly demanding through approximately August 14, 2026, including preparation and filing of a notice of appeal.
9. If meaningful relief is granted before August 15, I am prepared to resume petition circulation promptly to the extent those current obligations permit. Beginning approximately August 15, 2026—or immediately following a favorable ruling if it occurs later—I expect to be able to devote substantially greater available time to intensive petition circulation.
10. I intend to publicly disseminate the Court’s disposition and supporting public record and to use those communications to recruit and coordinate additional volunteer circulators and supporters.
11. I cannot presently guarantee the number of persons who will volunteer to assist. I can state that I intend actively to seek such assistance and that any additional circulators would supplement my own collection efforts.
12. I remain willing to proceed under an accelerated timetable and to comply with whatever lawful submission, objection, verification, review, or other election-administration procedures the Court determines are necessary.
13. If relief is granted, I am prepared to continue petition circulation through whatever deadline the Court determines remains legally and administratively workable for completion and submission of compliant nomination papers.
14. I continue to seek placement on the November 3, 2026 general-election ballot and remain prepared to make a substantial and immediate effort to satisfy every statutory qualification if meaningful relief remains available.
